HARRISBURG, PA (November 1, 2016) – McNees Wallace & Nurick attorney Devin Chwastyk will speak at the Dauphin County Bar Association on December 13, 2016 at a program entitled, “Cybersecurity for Lawyers and Law Firms: Strategies to Avoid Data Breaches.”

The event will begin with lunch at 11:30 a.m. followed by Chwastyk’s presentation at noon.

Chwastyk is the chair of McNees’ Privacy & Data Security Group. He speaks and writes frequently about cybersecurity issues and the legal risks.
